Did you know that in Northumberland, over 50% of the population are aged 50 or older and more than half of those are over 65? Did you know that in 2020, 85.5% of males and 82.7% of females over age 65 in Northumberland County reported a somewhat strong or very strong sense of belonging to community? This was more than 10% higher than the provincial average!
