- The <u>Northumberland Land Trust</u> created an agency fund which provides an annual disbursement to support their administrative operations.
- The <u>Cyril, Ann and Bernard Murphy Scholarship Fund</u> was created by a Cobourg family through a bequest in a Will to award two annual scholarships to graduating students from Cobourg's two high schools.
- The <u>Glover Family Fund</u> was created by a Canmore, Alberta family who have local roots in Warkworth and know the value of community foundations, to support social service groups in Trent Hills.
- The Northumberland Arts & Crafts Association, decided to cease operations in 2006 after 28 years of service and set up the <u>Northumberland Arts & Crafts - Jan</u> <u>and Evert Scheidt Fund</u> to support arts & culture in the community.
