anniversary, we feel that we have been very successful to date, and we would like to thank all of our incredible community partners which have assisted us in enriching our community.



2021 - OUR YEAR IN REVIEW

Grantmaking in 2021

Despite the continued pandemic restrictions, we were able to proceed with our annual grant program. Grant applications were received in January and approved in March, and luckily most projects were able to move forward this year.

We are pleased that we were able to support important community initiatives with the following funding:

- **\$45,512.52** in Community Impact Grants from our [Community Fund](#) to 13 local organizations.
- **\$23,920.00** in [Job Opportunity for Youth Grants](#) from our Community Fund to 6 local organizations, which provided summer employment for seven students.
- **\$2,856.00** for a Youth in Recreation Mini Grant from our [Ontario Endowment for Children and Youth in Recreation Fund](#).
- **\$77,432.52** to the Municipality of Trent Hills from the [Municipal Fund](#) for the Recreation and Wellness Centre commitment.

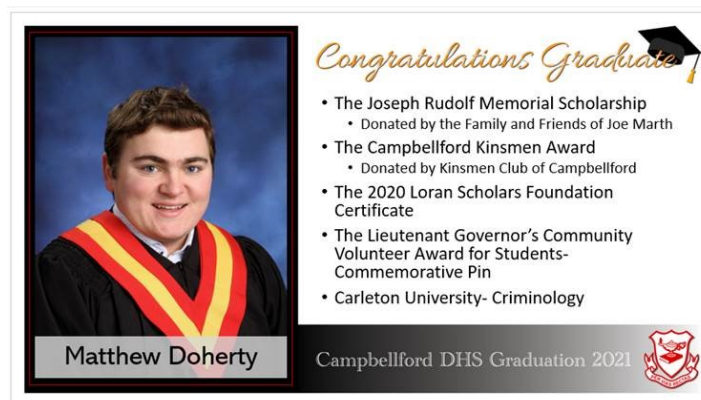

Vital Conversations are a community check-in conducted by community foundations across Canada to understand the vitality of our communities and identify trends in a range of areas critical to quality of life.

Two vital conversations were held at the Aron Theatre on December 15, 2021, with approximately 40 community members attending and providing comments. Staff from the Municipality of Trent Hills were invited to present their Corporate Energy Management Plan, as well as information on other environmental action opportunities being considered or implemented.
