We are very pleased to present Ann Clark as this year's guest speaker. Ann's topic is sustainable agriculture and the title of her talk is: Beef + Grass = Sustainability.

Ann has done extensive work in the area of "what can we as consumers do to enhance our community's environmental health". More specifically, Ann has researched and presented her idea of Grass Northumberland, a campaign designed to transform Northumberland into the innovative hub of grass-based livestock production and marketing in the province. Grass Northumberland would profile the argument that perennials – and the livestock that convert them to food – are both profitable and central to sustaining agriculture in the region.

E. Ann Clark joined the farming community in 2010, after a 30+ year career as a professor in Plant Agriculture, mostly at Guelph. Her research and teaching program on grazing and organic farming systems now support custom grazing of beef cow/calf and pastured poultry on her 100 acre farm outside of Warkworth.
